<b>6 Castanzu Vermentino di Sardegna, Sardegna, Italy</b>	<b>£17.00</b>	<b>£3.85</b>	<b>£4.55</b>
Citrus-fresh, characterful Sardinian white. Flavours of lemon, apple and tropical fruit are initially light, building to a textural honeyed feel with hints of lemon marmalade on the finish.			
<b>7 Domaine De Vedilhan Seriva, Viognier, Languedoc, France</b>	<b>£19.95</b>	<b>£3.95</b>	<b>£4.95</b>
Rich, luxurious and elaborately textured wine from Domaine de Vedilhan. Complex layers of lush, ripe stone fruit. Smooth and full flavoured, this is a great food friendly wine to accompany shell fish, scallops and aromatic dishes.			
<b>8 Alto Los Romeros Guwurztraminer Reserva, Valle Central, Chile</b>	<b>£20.95</b>	<b>£4.15</b>	<b>£5.35</b>
Pleasing intensity of fruit aromas with floral notes such as jasmine and white roses. On the palate it is light, with vibrant acidity, and a perfect balance.			
<b>9 Fiorile Pinot Grigio, Venetie, Italy</b>	<b>£22.00</b>		
This flavoursome Pinot Grigio is dry and fruity with slightly smoky notes. The development of this fuller flavour profile is aided by the cooler climate of Trentino's Alpine vineyards.			
<b>10 Duc de Morny Picpoul de Pinet, Languedoc, France</b>	<b>£22.50</b>		
Slightly perfumed, ripe melon fruit on the nose. The palate is weighty and ripe but remains fresh, dry and saline. This is the perfect example of the right grapes grown in the right terroir.			
<b>11 Three Choirs, The English House Medium Dry, English Regional Wine, England</b>	<b>£23.00</b>		
A good example of English wines' strength; attractive, floral aromatics, crisp fruit and a touch of balancing sugar			
<b>12 Caparrone Pecorino, Abruzzo, Italy</b>	<b>£23.50</b>		
Scooping The Wine Merchants 'Great Value White Trophy' is a huge accolade for this intriguing and increasingly fashionable variety. Some delicate floral and apricot notes are backed up with textured minerality, slightly nutty character and refreshing acidity.			
<b>13 Grüner Veltliner Terrassen, Jurtschitsch, Austria</b>	<b>£24.95</b>		
Spicy GV with good citrus fruit and plenty of flavour, succulent and ripe. Jurtschitsch use organic methods and make wines that are full of flavour.			
<b>14 Catalina Sounds, Sauvignon Blanc, Marlborough, New Zealand</b>	<b>£26.95</b>		
A Kiwi classic at its finest. Intense and expressive aromatics strike first followed by waves of lush, ripe tropical fruit flavours. Crisp, zesty and refreshingly fine.			
<b>15 Gorka Izagirre Txakoli, Bizkaiko Txakolina, Spain</b>	<b>£27.95</b>		
Possibly the only winery in the world to have a 3 Michelin-starred restaurant – Azurmendi. This stunning award winning dry white is bright and racy with green apple, white blossom and citrus freshness and a perfect match to almost any fish and seafood dishes.			
<b>16 Waterkloof "Circle of Life" White, Sauvignon, Chenin, Semillon, Stellenbosch, South Africa</b>	<b>£28.00</b>		
The complete food wine and only new world white listed at René Redzepi's Noma. Complex, richly flavoured, savoury, creamy with an uplifting balanced freshness.			
<b>17 Macon-Charnay, Clos Saint-Pierre, Burgundy, France</b>	<b>£29.95</b>		
A sublime single vineyard Macon that shows great typicity with peaches and cream from the lovely Chardonnay fruit. Partially oak fermented and then aged on lees for an extended 16 months to give real richness and depth of flavour.

Rich and complex, this has a lovely floral quality and a luscious weight on the dry finish			
<b>19 Jacobus Dry Riesling, Kühn, Rheingau, Germany</b>	<b>£31.95</b>		
This is a soft, attractive open wine with juicy apricot fruit sourced from Kühn's organic vineyards in Hallgarten. Easy and accessible, this is an ideal introduction to dry German wine.			
<b>20 Sancerre, André Dezat et Fils, 2015, France</b>	<b>£32.95</b>		
André Dezat and his sons produce one of the best Sancerres around; it is dry, fruity with a wonderfully delicate bouquet and great length. Their vineyards have three different types of soil which give added complexity.			
<b>21 Chablis 1er cru Les Forêts, Moreau-Naudet, 2013, France</b>	<b>£39.95</b>		
"A superb, intense Chablis, this has a lovely balance of lemony crispness and full, nutty richness. Forêts is a part of Montmains 1er cru and is a relatively new wine for Stéphane Moreau, a young grower forging a good reputation.			
<b>22 Adelsheim Caitlin's Reserve Chardonnay, Oregon, 2013, USA</b>	<b>£50.00</b>		
This prestigious family estate were one of Oregon's founding wineries. This ultra-fine Chardonnay is crafted in very much a Burgundian style. Rich and complex but impeccably balanced and long.			
<b>23 Condrieu, La Bonnette, René Rostaing, 2012, France</b>	<b>£75.00</b>		
This is an extremely elegant Condrieu. No oak is used and the result is a gloriously floral, aromatic, peachy nose with hints of violets. Pure white peach abounds and there is a satisfying, mineral, long finish.			
<b>24 Chassagne-Montrachet 1er cru Clos Saint Jean, 2013, France</b>	<b>£80.00</b>		
From the single vineyard of Clos St Jean, this has lovely, explosive fruit on the palate. Mineral, delicious and long with a dry, nutty, silky finish. Not overly oaky as the Pillot's keep barrel ageing to a minimum.

<b>25 Zorgvliet 'Silvermyn, Cabernet Franc Rosé, South Africa</b>	<b>£17.00</b>	<b>£3.85</b>	<b>£4.55</b>
A juicy, fruity and easy drinking pink from Zorgvliet (translates as "no worries") hillside vineyards in the picturesque Banghoek ward. This off-dry rosé will suit almost any occasion.			
<b>26 Chateau Galoupet Cru Classe Rose, Provence, France</b>	<b>£27.95</b>		
A classic Provence Rose, with a delicate pale pink rose colour. The nose is floral with hints of lychees, the palate more pronounced with great flavours of cherries and raspberries. The finish is elegant and fruity			

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<b>RED WINE</b>			
<b>27 Martinfort Carignan Sélection Vieilles Vignes, Languedoc, France</b>	<b>£17.00</b>	<b>£3.85</b>	<b>£4.55</b>
Round, full and soft red with good chunky fruit and excellent concentration. There are a lot of old Carignan vines in the south of France and from low yields they make wonderfully			
<b>28 Barbera d'Asti 'Ceppi Sorici', Piemonte, Italy</b>	<b>£18.95</b>	<b>£3.95</b>	<b>£4.95</b>
A wine of stunning value and presence. Vibrant black cherry fruit character is prominent on the nose and palate. The low tannins bring forward the fruitiness and allow the fresh acidity to work seamlessly with most red meats and even pork belly.			
<b>29 Santa Ema Select Terroir Cabernet Sauvignon, Maipo Valley, Chile</b>	<b>£20.95</b>	<b>£4.15</b>	<b>£5.35</b>
Based in the Maipo Valley just south of Santiago, Santa Ema has been quietly, reliably producing very good value Cabernet Sauvignon for many years now and the result is this juicy, purely fruited, elegant, medium bodied Cabernet Sauvignon.			
<b>30 LA Cetto Petite Sirah, Baja California, Mexico</b>	<b>£23.50</b>		
Great density and concentration here, this is fairly soft and low-acid, with bags of blueberry fruit and velvety tannins			
<b>31 'Azul', Guelbuenzu, Ribera del Quieles, Spain</b>	<b>£25.50</b>		
Deep ruby red colour with violet reflections. This wine has red berry fruit perfumes with a hint of spice. Full-bodied with firm tannins, this wine is well balanced with lots of ripe fruit flavours.			
<b>32 Fleurie, Domaine de la Virolette, J Charlet, France</b>	<b>£26.00</b>		
Attractive, wild strawberry fruit is abundant in this wine making it a particularly juicy and good value example. Fleurie is the most famous of the ten superior, 'cru' villages of Beaujolais			
<b>33 Tabali, Carmenere Reserva, Cachapoal, Chile</b>	<b>£26.85</b>		
Intensely fruity, yet elegant expression of this Chilean speciality produced by Chilean winemaker of the year Felipe Muller. Soft, smoky complex mocha and spice layers are silky smooth and incredibly satisfying			
<b>34 Churchills Estate, Douro, Portugal</b>	<b>£27.50</b>		
After years of research and development, Johnny Graham now has Churchill Estates producing excellent table wines. His Douro red has a complex nose, blackberry fruits and a floral hint, the eight months in oak giving rounded tannins.			
<b>35 Stobi Vranec, Tikves, Macedonia</b>	<b>£27.95</b>		
Not for the fainthearted, this is a rich, full bodied wine that packs a powerful punch. Dense brambly fruit with blackberry, coffee and liquorice flavours with good, round tannins on the finish.			
<b>36 The Dry Land Collection, Pinotage, I Paarl, South Africa</b>	<b>£28.00</b>		
A sumptuous, textural and bright Pinotage packed with dark alluring fruit. A wine that oozes quality and drinkability and pairs really well with grilled meats, casseroles and blue cheese.			
<b>37 Nieto 'Don Nicanor', Malbec, Mendoza, Argentina</b>	<b>£29.50</b>		
Classic Mendoza Malbec. Deep and soulful with distinctive dark berry fruit aroma's with accent of mocha and dark chocolate.			
<b>38 Valpolicella Classico Ripasso, Capitel della Crosara, Veneto, Italy</b>	<b>£30.50</b>		
Sommelier Wine Awards Gold medal winning, single vineyard 'baby Amarone'. A lovely, decadent wine which gives mouthfuls of luscious morello cherry flavours and gentle spice and vanilla notes.			
<b>39 Magpie Estate 'Knock Knock', Shiraz, Barossa, Australia</b>	<b>£31.95</b>		
Master of Barossa Shiraz, Rolf Binder has produced an invigorating and decadent wine showing dense, sweet blackberry fruit aroma's with sweet spices. A full and flavoursome mouthfeel is intense, satisfying and quite simply breath-taking.			

<b>40 Domain Road Pinot Noir, Central Otago, 2011, New Zealand</b>	<b>£35.95</b>	
From the heart of an old gold mining area that is to be found in the south of New Zealand comes this excellent Pinot with ripe strawberry/ plum fruit and classy finish.		
<b>41 Massaya 'Terrases de Baalbeck', Bekaa Valley, 2012, Lebanon</b>	<b>£36.95</b>	
Vinification and ageing is done in French oak to give depth and complexity to this serious and concentrated wine. This blend of Southern Rhone varieties is packed with flavour, finesse and elegance.		
<b>42 Château Montaguillon, Montagne-Saint-Emilion, 2014, France</b>	<b>£37.95</b>	
Structured, with a delicious supple plum and red fruit character		
<b>43 Vina Real Reserva, Rioja, CVNE 2010, Spain</b>	<b>£39.95</b>	
A typical Rioja from a highly respected firm - summer strawberry and oak flavours combine		
<b>44 Barolo Manfredi, Farigliano 2011, Italy</b>	<b>£42.95</b>	
Blender and bottler Manfredi makes a good value barolo with aromas of dried fruit and leather then a rich mouthful with a good balance of acidity and tannin		
<b>45 Châteauneuf-du-Pape, Télégramme, 2013, France</b>	<b>£44.95</b>	
Lovely soft fruit with spice, plums, herbs and a touch of leather behind. Quite forward in the mouth with soft, ripe tannins, great length and a luscious finish.		
<b>46 Clos du Val Zinfandel, Napa Valley, California, USA,</b>	<b>£45.00</b>	
Brambly and cranberry notes of spice, minerals, black pepper and cherry marry with some subtle tobacco aromas. Ripe, red berry fruit dominates throughout the palate, with savoury notes and vanilla. It is a beautifully balanced wine with a silky mouthfeel and moderate tannins.		
<b>47 Amarone della Valpolicella, Montesor 'Fondatore', 2012, Italy</b>	<b>£50.00</b>	
A classic Amarone. Rich and complex, powerful yet approachable. Complex aromas of black cherry, violets and coffee. The palate is smooth, round and richly textured with a medley of spice, dried fruits and supple tannins giving a long and satisfying finish.

<b>48 El Aziz Late Harvest Grillo, Sicily</b>	<b>£22.95</b>	<b>50cl</b>

Light, fresh, bone dry and slightly salty, La Gitana is one of Sanlúcar de Barrameda's best known Manzanillas. It makes an excellent accompaniment to green olives, Jámón Iberico and to many fish dishes.

**54 Don Gonzalo Oloroso, VOS Jerez, Valdespino** £5.75 50ml

Mahogany coloured. Aromas and flavours of caramel, toasted almonds and dried apricots. Very expressive and complex. Good acidity, and a very long persistent finish.

**55 Justino's Madeira, Colheita 1996** £8.00 75 ml

Elegant aromas create a rich, ripe nose with hints of grapefruit and roast walnut notes. The palate combines caramel, almond, orange peel and toffee apple notes before a very round and complex finish.
